ZIMBABWE UPDATE

On Wednesday, August 16th, Sue and Gordon Wetmore, my husband Frank and I drove up to Rochester, NH and arrived at Spaulding High School. There we joined a crowd of volunteers, high school football players and many organizations donating goods to Zimbabwe.

I'll let Connie Littleton share with you, from her recent email:

What a wonderful and fast day of packing we had on August 16th! All of the documentation was completed within 12 hours and the container is now out to sea, heading toward the Bahamas.

Here are the stats:

- 23 groups participated.
- We packed 1073 pieces weighing 23,360 pounds. (Imagine!)

Our biggest categories were school supplies (238, which included all those chairs and desks), clothing (219 boxes), books (131 boxes), medical supplies (119). Athletic supplies, bedding, bicycles, household supplies, music supplies, office supplies, personal care items, sewing supplies, shoes, tools, toys, yarn, a generator and a solar panel rounded out the contents.

It was the fastest packing ever with so many adult volunteers and 33 student volunteers from Spaulding High School, primarily from the football and girls' soccer teams.

God bless all of you and your teams for the wonderful participation in such a loving endeavor! Using Connie's directions, on Monday August 28th, I logged on to marinetraffic.com and entered the ship's name:

For those interested in the ship's journey, you can do the same at any time. We were able to collect 16 boxes of donations and 20 child chairs; thanks to your generosity. Outreach will continue to keep you updated as the cargo ship. As Connie concluded in her email...

The shipping company anticipates it will reach Beira the first week of October and Mutare in mid October. We shall see!
