Looking for Jesus

Blessed Friends in Faith,

Eastertide is the time we recall how Jesus is seen in risen form. After all the events of the passion week and his death on a cross and time in the tomb, he is alive to his nearest and dearest companions.

This is the central mystery of the Christian faith. That Jesus died, Jesus rose, and comes again is spoken in worship all over the world every week. The gospel accounts tell us that Mary and other friends of Jesus go early to the tomb on the third day. They were looking for Jesus.

In their grief, shock and profound sorrow they did not recognize the risen Jesus at first. They thought he was the gardener. In John 20:15 Jesus asks, "Why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" After another moment Jesus says, "Mary!" And she realizes it is Jesus. Later Mary will talk to the others saying, "I have seen the Lord!"

Appearing to more in the group in the evening, Jesus invites them to receive the Holy Spirit and sends them into the world to "forgive the sins of anyone." That is a powerful commission. The idea is that when we forgive others, we enact the central purpose of Jesus' ministry in our midst.

The world remains a very unforgiving place. Nature can bring devastations. Humanity dissolves into chaos in conflict. These are the places we search for to see Jesus. Who bears the face of welcome, acceptance, and transformative love?

This Easter. Every Easter. We recall the fervent search of Mary on that first day of the week. We are looking for Jesus in a world that needs saving grace and redeeming love. Easter faith is not the end of a season, but the beginning of a whole new time of living, loving, and growing by the grace of God.

May our faith be increased every day in our search to see our Lord! Pastor Ken
