#### A note on the music

Lead Us, O Father: I found this piece while digging through the choir files. The lyrics are by William H. Burleigh (1812-1871), a hymn-writer and reformer. Burleigh was a member of the Unitarian Church. The music was written by John Lamont Galbraith (1870-1930) in 1911. Galbraith was a composer and organist who was born in Scotland and died in Virginia. O Sacred Head, Sore Wounded: This new melody was composed by the African American composer David Hurd. The editors of the hymnal *Wonder, Love, and Praise* point out that pairing new music with old texts forces us to examine the text anew. "The point of Dr. Hurd's fine tune is not to replace the great German chorale; it is, rather, to say through musical sound some things about the text which the chorale cannot... By internalizing the melodic and harmonic patterns of the Blues, [Hurd] has gotten to the 'wail' of the text."


# The Original Congregational Church United Church of Christ, Wrentham, MA Open and Affirming Covenant Adopted on June 5, 2022
